Despite the flooding and saturated fields and gardens, the total rainfall for March 2022 was substantially less than for March 2021 (526mm vs 822mm) when our last flood occurred. The Village residents were treated to enhanced water views.

Winter Recipe Ideas

Easy Beef Curry

It is best to prepare curry a day before required, to allow the flavours to develop. Curry can be frozen for up to 4 months.

Serves 2-4

INGREDIENTS

- 400g rump steak
- 1 large onion, sliced
- 1 clove garlic, crushed
- 1 teaspoon grated fresh ginger
- 2 teaspoons malt/brown vinegar
- 2 teaspoons light soy sauce
- 1/4 teaspoon chilli powder
- 2 teaspoons mild curry powder
- 1 tablespoon tomato paste
- 1 cup water
- 1 small beef stock cube, crumbled
- 2 teaspoons cornflour
- 2 tablespoons water, extra



METHOD

Step 1

Cut steak into cubes. Combine steak, onion, garlic, ginger, vinegar, soy sauce, chilli and curry powders, tomato paste, water and stock cube in saucepan.

Step 2

Bring to the boil, reduce heat and simmer uncovered for 45 minutes or until steak is tender.

Step 3

Blend the cornflour with the extra water and add to curry. Cook for a further 1-2 minutes until it thickens. Serve with rice.
