Exercise continues to be an important feature of our activity program at Avalon House. Each week the residents are put through their paces either in the gentle exercise classes run by the RAOs or the Balance and Strength class facilitated by Amy or Exercise with Adrian, our two in house physiotherapists. Helen often runs a seated yoga class where we incorporate slow breathing and mindfulness as we move. In addition, we also have the wonderful Ageless Moves ladies, who get everyone moving with their energetic routines, using pom poms and lively music equally our regular monthly drumming sessions are also physical, using the rhythm of the music to create movements and interactions. Many residents love to walk, and will do the rounds of the building, often pausing to chat to others, or meet in the coffee shop for a well-earned cappuccino, and we hold regular Walk and Talk activities where we walk in the neighbourhood, building our relationship with the local community and admiring the gardens and nature as we pass. Other regular activities are carpet bowls and balloon tennis, where we test our coordination and response, as well as having great fun working as a team.

There are so many known positive benefits to regular exercise, keeping the body active and strong can enable independence as well as reducing the risks of falls, and as we work in a group, we are sharing a social interaction and improving our mental health.
